

X *Agropogon lutosus* (Poir.) P. Fourn.

Perennial Beard-grass

Native

Least Concern

VC5 Absent; VC6 Extinct

A perennial, loosely tufted grass of muddy salt marshes, largely in southern England, also occasionally arising as a casual on rubbish-tips. This intergeneric hybrid between *Agrostis stolonifera* and *Polypogon monspeliensis* has only ever been recorded at one site in Somerset. Found with both parents on a disused tip near Glastonbury in 1973 by C.A. Howe, it persisted at this site for some years and was last recorded in 1979 by A.L. Grenfell.
