Archaeophyte GB: Near Threatened England: Least Concern VC5 Absent; VC6 Lost

An annual grass of sandy arable fields, tracks and waste ground. In Somerset, only ever found as a casual, in VC6. Recorded in a lane near Keynsham in 1898 by D. Fry, on a dust-heap at Bath in 1899 and at Portishead station-yard in 1904 (White, 1912). Last seen by H.S. Thompson in 1931 at Berrow sands (ST25), on the strand-line at high water mark, (specimen in **BIRM**, see http://herbariaunited.org/specimen/286321/?image). This species is now mainly to be found around London and in East Anglia, Lincolnshire and South Yorkshire.
