## Carex x deserta Merino

(C. laevigata x binervis)

Native GB: Vulnerable VC5 Rare; VC6 Absent

A rare hybrid sedge first found in Britain in 1961 by Arthur Chater, on a damp roadside slope near Llyn Du, north of Tremadog, Caernarfonshire, and re-found nearby in 2009 (Jones, 2010). The only other known sites are in Somerset. In VC5 first found in 1998, growing with both parents in a wet flush on Dunkery Hill, Exmoor (Stace *et al.*, 2015). In 2010, Jeanne Webb found this hybrid at a second location nearby, at Holt Ball, near Luccombe. With a new location discovered near each of the original sites, this hybrid may be increasing in Britain and in Somerset, although it may have been overlooked in the past.
