Alien GB & England: Endangered Schedule 8 Section 41 GB Rare VC5 Absent; VC6 Lost

A decumbent annual of muddy shingle at the edge of ponds. Only recorded once in Somerset, as an alien, when S.T. Dunn (1896) reported finding a few plants with Mr H. Griffith on waste ground at Tiverton [Twerton] near Bath, where great quantities of cinders had been deposited along the river bank. As a native in Britain this species is now found only at Slapton Ley in Devon; it occasionally occurs as an alien elsewhere and has been reintroduced near its former site at Loe Pool in Cornwall.
