## Prunella x intermedia Link

(P. vulgaris x P. laciniata)

## Native VC5 Rare; VC6 Rare


A rhizomatous perennial of short calcareous grassland, usually found wherever P. laciniata grows or has grown. In Somerset, first discovered at Cheddar by C.E. Salmon and reported to E.S. Marshall by C.E. Moss in a letter dated August 1913 (Marshall, 1914). This was soon after White (1906) had first described *P. laciniata* as a species new to Britain; White (1912) had dismissed purple-flowered plants found by Mrs Gregory as merely a colour variant of P. laciniata. In 1965, C.A. Howe found this hybrid at Green Down, Charlton Mackrell, where it is still to be found with *P. laciniata*. In 1966, he found the hybrid again, at Compton Pauncefoot, growing in the absence of P. laciniata. A few plants of P. x intermedia were re-found there in 1993, however none have been found in recent searches and the plant is feared lost due to under-grazing. In 2014, this hybrid was found by Somerset Rare Plants Group growing with both parents at Langridge. In VC5, vegetative plants were found by Ellen McDouall and Somerset Rare Plants Group at Cadbury Castle in 2014; they were later confirmed as this hybrid and further plants have been found nearby. No plants of *P. laciniata* have ever been recorded from that area. The persistence of this hybrid at a site after P. laciniata has disappeared has been observed elsewhere, indeed the hybrid is believed to contribute to the disappearance of *P. laciniata*, the species being "hybridised out of existence" (Bowen, 2000). At Cheddar and Green Down, however, the species has persisted alongside the hybrid, for around a century in the case of the Cheddar population. This hybrid has been lost from some former sites within its range. Somerset plants are at the western edge of its distribution, with the exception of sites in Ireland.
