Smooth Rupturewort

An annual or short-lived mat-forming perennial of compacted sandy or gravelly soils. In Somerset, known only from one site in VC6, where first recorded by Sole "On the coast at Weston super Mare" (Collinson, 1791). This record was considered by Murray (1896) to be "Doubtless a mistake", but in 1946 this species was found by G. Nicholls near the sea front on a site occupied by American troops (Green et al., 2000) and recorded there the following year by Noel Sandwith. Roe (1981) considered it to be casual at that site; however in 1983 it was refound by A.J. Byfield and C. and M.A.R. Kitchen in sandy maritime grassland near the sea front. The site, Ellenborough Park West, was designated as an SSSI in 1989. In some years over 1000 plants have been counted and in 1998 a single plant was found by Stephen Parker outside the park. The continued existence of *Herniaria glabra* at Ellenborough Park is dependant on disturbance of the site: in the past it has been used by a local school as a playing field, resulting in scuffed areas of grassland perfect for colonisation by this species. Recently, however, this use has ceased and there has been reduced access to the site: without periodic disturbance, this species may be lost. Herniaria glabra is considered to be native in East Anglia and Cambridgeshire, but a casual alien elsewhere. The early first record, and associated species of sandy areas, make its status in Somerset less certain, but this species undeniably has a precarious future at its one site in Somerset.
